NOTICE OF PUBLIC INFORMATION CENTRE #1 CITY OF BRANTFORD DEVELOPMENT CHARGES BACKGROUND STUDY, 2018-19 PRESENTATION OF FIRST PHASE OF ANALYSIS

On Friday September 28, 2018, you are invited to attend the City of Brantford's initial public information session in relation to the 2018-19 Development Charges Background Study:

Development Charges are fees levied against new development to pay for the capital costs of servicing growth. The City's current consolidated Development Charges By-law 38-2014, as amended, is in force and effect for five years and will expire on April 22, 2019. Council must complete a Development Charges Background Study and adopt a new By-law prior to that date. Under an Agreement dated May 24, 2018, the City of Brantford has retained the services of Hemson Consulting Ltd. to prepare the new Development Charges Background Study, including the associated by-law and policies.

In addition to reflecting approved capital programs, the DC Study must be supported by a number of comprehensive, Council-approved documents, including the Official Plan, Transportation Master Plan, Master Servicing Plan and Boundary Expansion Lands Master Plan. Although updates to all of these Plans are currently in progress, for a number of valid reasons (Municipal Boundary Expansion, new Provincial Growth Plan Initiatives, etc.), they will not be completed and adopted by City Council before April 2019. Consequently, the Hemson Study will be based on updating the 2013-2014 Study in accordance with the previously approved plans that are currently in effect.

This public information session will include a presentation by Hemson Consulting Ltd. on the first phase of their analysis, and will be followed by a question and answer period. The following items will be discussed:

- Draft growth forecasts
- Draft service categories
- Draft historic service level information
- Policy-related issues
- Preliminary capital program

The meeting is primarily geared towards the development community; however, interested groups and the general public are welcome to attend as well.

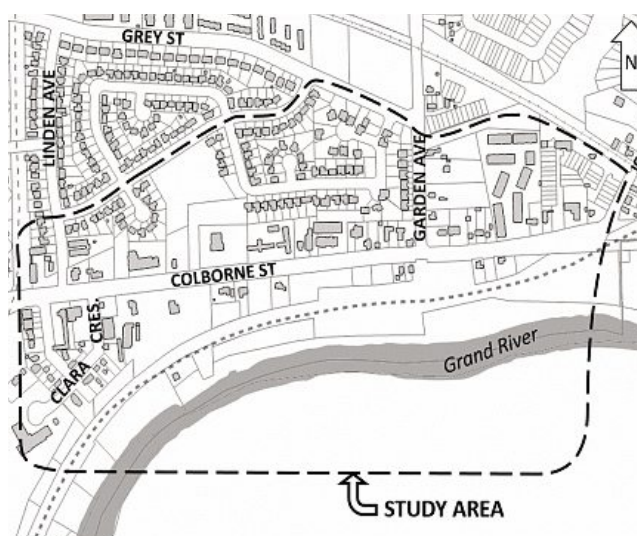

NOTICE OF STUDY COMMENCEMENT MUNICIPAL CLASS ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT FOR THE COLBORNE STREET (EAST) SLOPE STABILIZATION

THE STUDY

The City of Brantford has initiated a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) Schedule 'C' for a section of Colborne Street. The study area encompasses approximately 1200 metres along Colborne Street between Linden Avenue and Johnson Road and includes the embankment extending to the Grand River. Ecosystem Recovery Inc. has been retained by the City of Brantford to complete the study.

The study is intended to identify and evaluate alternatives, as well as to develop concepts to improve, manage or mitigate slope stability concerns in the study area. The findings of this project may also result in amendments to the GRCA's regulated area mapping of Ontario Regulation 150/06 made under the Conservation Authorities Act. As well, any new mapping to identify the extent of the natural hazard area may also be reflected in the new Official Plan for the City of Brantford as well as future updates to the Zoning By-law



THE PROCESS

The study is being conducted in compliance with Schedule 'C' requirements of the Municipal Engineers Association "Municipal Class Environmental Assessment," (October 2000, as amended 2007 & 2011) as approved under the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act. A key component of the study will be consultation with interested stakeholders (public, landowners and agencies). Three (3) Public Information Centres (PICs) will be held to provide interested parties with an opportunity to review and discuss issues related to the project. The first PIC is to be held as follows:

The first PIC will provide an overview of the Environmental Assessment process, provide a review of the existing conditions of the study area and demonstrate the processes occurring on the slope. The study team seeks input on the planning alternatives being considered, concerns, requirements, and specific issues.

Upon completion of the study, an Environmental Study Report will be prepared and posted for public review and comment. The document will detail the planning process and provide the preferred alternative. A Notice of Completion will be issued at that stage.

PUBLIC COMMENT INVITED

We are interested in hearing any comments or concerns that you may have about this study. Comments and information regarding the study are being collected to assist the City of Brantford in meeting the requirements of the Environmental Assessment Act. This material will be maintained on file for use during the project and may be included in project documentation. With the exception of personal information, all comments will become part of the public record.
